2012 will be valued as a successful year for the International Takhi Group, the main event clearly being the celebration of 20 years of Takhi-re-introduction in Mongolia.



Report

Population Development

The Takhi population developed very well in 2012 with 13 foals surviving throughout the whole area. In May four stallions from the Jimsar breeding center in China were brought to Takhin Us and in August Zoo Prague organized the transport of four mares selected by the European Endangered Species Program (EEP) to Takhintal.



Population Development of the Przewalski's horses in the Great Gobi B SPA Figures refer to a "horse-year", starting annually on May 1st and ending on April 30th of the following year.

76 Takhis at the beginning of wintertime

There are four harem-groups roaming the Gobi B, joined by the group of mares, which came to the Gobi B in 2012, and several bachelor groups of changing composition. Altogether rangers counted 76 Takhis in November 2012.

20 years of Takhi-Reintroduction

In June the three Takhi-reintroduction-projects **Takhintal**, **Hustai Nuuru** and **Homintal** celebrated their 20th anniversary. Various activities were held in Mongolia.

- Celebration of all three projects at Ulan Baatar

- Production of a booklet titled "Takhi back to the Wild 20 years of Takhi reintroduction in Mongolia" in English and Mongolian.

In June representatives of the nomads, officials of different political organisations and the park management met for a workshop on the implementation of the Management Plan Gobi B. The 36 delegates also discussed their experiences and future perspectives. These meetings also prove to be important in order to maintain networking. First results are:
